



Ajay Govind is an award-winning writer-director with over 19 years of experience. He studied English literature at St. Stephen's College and established his communications agency words rhythms images in 2008. He has directed over 100 commissioned videos for social sector organizations, directed 2 feature films, 4 short films and 5 music videos. His last directorial film was the feature film Madappally United. After a successful run at many Indian and international festivals, this Malayalam children's film continues to be screened at various educational institutions. His work in the social sector has hugely informed his fiction work where he tries to weave thought-provoking social messages into the narrative. In Basanti Tailors, he presents his take on recycling and circularity through the story of a tailor and her granddaughter.



Manish Mundra is a producer, filmmaker and the founder of Drishyam Films. After a chance interaction with Rajat Kapoor on Twitter in 2013, he agreed to finance Ankhon Dekhi (2014). The film went on to win three Filmfare Awards and three Screen Awards. Since then, there has been no looking back for the corporate leader-turned-film producer. Drishyam Films is a global motion picture studio that has produced international awardwinning films such as Masaan (2015), Umrika (2015), Waiting (2015), Dhanak (2016), Newton (2017), Rukh (2017), Kadvi Hawa (2017), Kaamyaab (2020), Ram Prasad Ki Tehrvi (2021) and Love Hostel (2022). Newton won the National Award for Best Hindi Film, and was also selected as India's official entry to the Academy Awards in 2018. Finally, in 2022 he donned the director's hat for his feature film Siya, starring Pooja Pandey and Vineet Kumar Singh. The critically acclaimed social drama was also an official selection at the 53rd International Film Festival of India, and was nominated for Best Debut.

Additionally, Manish is also known for establishing the Drishyam–Sundance Institute Screenwriters Lab for aspiring Indian screenwriters. He was named as one of Variety magazine's Top 10 Producers to Watch Out For in 2017. Beyond cinema, Manish is a passionate painter, writer, and photographer. He has authored two poetry collections—Mosaic and Kuch Adhuri Baatein—as well as a wildlife photography book titled Wild Africa.
